Meanwhile, if we leave out any feature of the newsletter that you previously enjoyed, please let us know and we'll find a way to include it in the future.



The success of our school depends on how many children we have enrolled, so your responses to our survey will help us to best choose our marketing style. Thank you for your replies!




## Reduce, Reuse, Recycle


## Get Your Spidey-Senses Tingling
