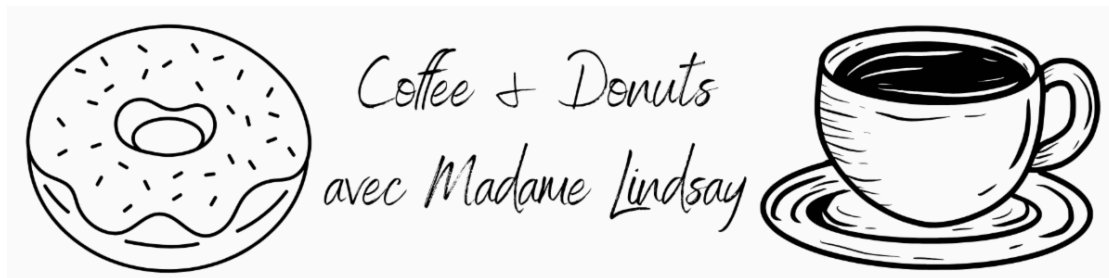


École Saint-Landry will be closed for Labor Day on September 1, 2025. Enjoy your long weekend and we'll see you back at school on September 2nd!

The first Labor Day was celebrated in New York City on September 5, 1882. Too many American workers had dangerous and demanding jobs that required them to work sometimes 12 hours a day, 6 days a week. They teamed up into unions to bargain for better pay, safer working conditions, and shorter hours. The unions held a parade on this first Labor Day to show their solidarity and then everyone had a picnic together.

It wasn't until 12 years later, in 1894, that Congress officially declared Labor Day a national holiday, recognizing the contributions of workers.

Today, many people still celebrate Labor Day with picnics and parades!

Bus Rules & Expectations

École Saint-Landry uses St. Landry Parish School Board buses, and students and parents must follow the Board's expectations for bus behavior.

All children who ride the bus are expected to wait in the car with their parents until the bus arrives. Parents should walk their children to the bus and remain until they board safely. Parking lots can be dangerous places for children, and these satellite stops are located on commercial properties that do not permit children climbing fences or damaging property in any way. Students are considered under school rules as soon as they begin waiting for the bus, even while in the care of their parents.

The following information has been copied from the [District Student Handbook](#), pages 38-42:

Bus Regulations

- Students shall:
 - cooperate with the driver since their safety depends on it
 - be on time because the bus will not wait
 - follow the driver's instructions when loading and unloading
 - remain quiet enough not to distract the driver

- have written permission from parent or guardian and be authorized by the principal or designee to get off at a stop other than their own
- be courteous and safety-conscious to protect and enjoy their riding privilege
- Students shall not:
 - stand when the bus is in motion
 - extend arms, head, or objects out of windows or doors
 - throw objects in the bus or out of windows or doors
 - use the emergency door outside of emergencies
 - eat or drink on the bus
 - board the bus at the incorrect stop
 - leave the bus without permission
 - use profane language
 - **refuse to occupy an assigned seat***
 - **damage the bus in any way***
 - **use tobacco, matches, cigarette lighters, obscene material, telecommunications devices***
 - **fight on the bus***
 - **show disrespect to the driver***
 - **commit an immoral or vicious act***
 - **show willful disobedience***
 - **carry objects or implements which can be used as weapons***

Bus Discipline Progression

Students may be subject to the following consequences for minor offenses:

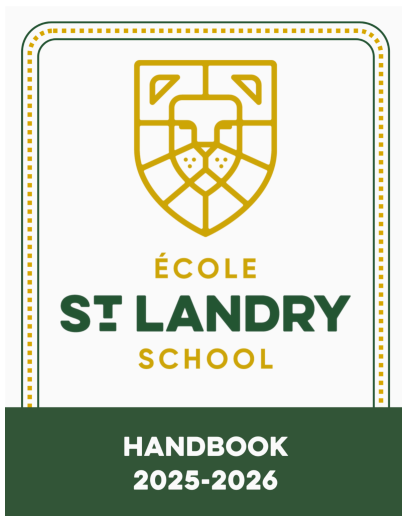
- First Offense
 - Conference will be held with the student
 - Parent/guardian will be notified
 - Warning citation will be issued
- Second Offense
 - A conference with student and parent/guardian will be held
- Third Offense
 - Written notification to parent/guardian will be made
 - Student will be denied bus transportation for 3-5 days
- Fourth Offense
 - Permanent suspension for the school year from all bus transportation will be enforced after notifying parent/guardian

****Major offenses** will result in more severe punishment such as suspension/expulsion from school. Any misbehavior on the bus, walking to or from the bus stop, or going to or returning from school may result in temporary or permanent loss of bus riding privileges. In this case, transportation to and from school becomes the responsibility of the parent/guardian.

Transportation for Grades 2nd and Under:

In the event a responsible party is not at the bus stop to accept these students, an attempt will be made to contact the parent by phone number on record and a suitable designated stop for the child will be agreed upon. If we are unable to contact a parent, the child will be brought to the school. After normal business hours, the child will be brought to the local police authority or to the St. Landry Parish Sheriff's Department and may be reported to child protection services.

Please remember to carefully review the **Parent Welcome Packet** each year, as it changes with State and District policies, as well as our own board-approved decisions as a charter school.

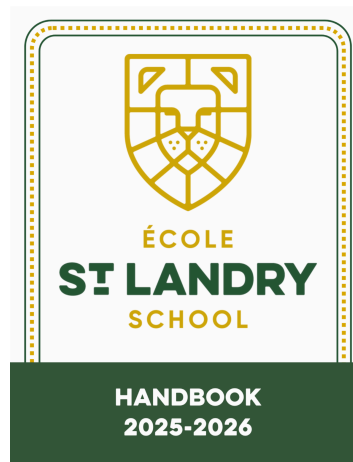

General Information:

Attendance/check-ins and -outs:

If your child is going to be absent, please do not call us. **If your child will be out of school for two or more days**, you can **[email us](#)** or just send the doctor's excuse in their green folder when they return to school. We can also accept **up to three** hand-written parental excuses per school year. Parental excuses can only cover two consecutive days of absence. If your child is sick longer than that, you will need a doctor's excuse to have the extra days covered. Any excuse must be received within five days of the absence.

You may also request make-up work, homework, and more to be prepared by the teacher for you to pick up in the office.

If you are running late, please remember to sign in your child in the office when you get here. You do not need to let us know in advance.

If you need to check your child out early, please come to the office to sign him out before 3:15 p.m. You do not need to let us know in advance unless you have an official reason for needing to check your child out between 3:15 and 3:45. In that case, please **email us**.

Transportation changes:

If your child is usually a bus-rider but you will be picking him or her up today, or vice-versa, or if you need to leave your child in afternoon Lion Care today, please **email us** before 3:15 p.m.

We request email whenever possible so we have a paper trail of your instructions. If ever you email and we do not reply by 3:15 p.m., please call the office at (337) 510-3022 to confirm that your email was received.



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
