Dear Families,

As we approach the Holiday season, I thought it would be a good opportunity to remind you all that we are headed into the peak of the flu and cold season. Along with these common illnesses we can't forget about other common illnesses we see in the school setting, including, but not limited to RSV, COVID-19, gastroenteritis, and strep throat. To help decrease the risk of transmission and control the spread of infections, please encourage your children to do the following:

- 1. Handwashing: this is one of the best ways to prevent the spread of respiratory and gastrointestinal illnesses. It is important to teach, reinforce, and encourage your children to wash and or sanitize their hands throughout the day.
- 1. Respiratory Etiquette: encourage and reinforce children to cover their cough/sneeze, either with a tissue or into their elbow. Discourage coughing/sneezing in their hands. Handwashing should be done immediately after blowing your nose/coughing/sneezing.

Additionally if you believe that your child is sick or getting sick, here are some tips to help you decide whether or not to send your child to school:

- 1. Definitely Stay Home: Oral temperature greater than 100 degrees, vomiting, diarrhea, general feelings of fatigue, discomfort, weakness, and muscle aches, wet or croupy cough, lots of nasal congestion with frequent blowing of nose.
- 1. Consider Staying Home: Stuffy/runny nose, mild sore throat with NO known exposure to Strep throat, headache, mild stomach ache.

Reminder: Keeping sick children home is another important way to control the spread of infections. A child who has a fever should remain at home until "fever free" for a minimum of 24 hours without fever reducing medication. A child who has started antibiotics must be on medication for 24 hours before returning to school.

Marigold brought cookies she'd baked with her mom the night before to class to share with her friends. Each student got two cookies for dessert after lunch! When Marigold saw there were




still several cookies left over, she walked around campus to distribute them to teachers.

It is vital for us to be on the same page with you about our policies, and we prefer to communicate everything through this one, easily-accessible reference.



General Information:

Attendance/check-ins and -outs:

If your child is going to be absent, please do not call us. If your child will be out of school for two or more days, you can email us or just send the doctor's excuse in their green folder when they return to school. We can also accept up to three hand-written parental excuses per school year. Parental excuses can only cover two consecutive days of absence. If your child is sick longer than that, you will need a doctor's excuse to have the extra days covered. Any excuse must be received within five days of the absence.

You may also request make-up work, homework, and more to be prepared by the teacher for you to pick up in the office.

If you are running late, please remember to sign in your child in the office when you get here. You do not need to let us know in advance.

If you need to check your child out early, please come to the office to sign him out before 3:00 p.m. You do not need to let us know in advance unless you have an official reason for needing to check your child out between 3:00 and 3:45. In that case, please **email us.**
