SEL Themes for the Month

- Responsible decision-making
- Self-awareness
- Relationship skills

Responsible decision-making has been an ongoing topic, moreso with our older grades. We have been talking about how important it is to make the right decisions, thinking before acting. Even at a young age, making responsible decisions is very important for the future.

Self-Awareness is letting the students understand their own thoughts, feelings, values, beliefs, and actions. They are exploring who they are, what they want, how they feel. They are learning that it's ok to feel bad on some days, and understanding why they do the things they do.

For the littles, the idea of relationship skills was broken down for better understanding. We discussed developing friendships, listening to the feelings of our friends, playing fair, and being honest.
