Family Engagement Team (FET)

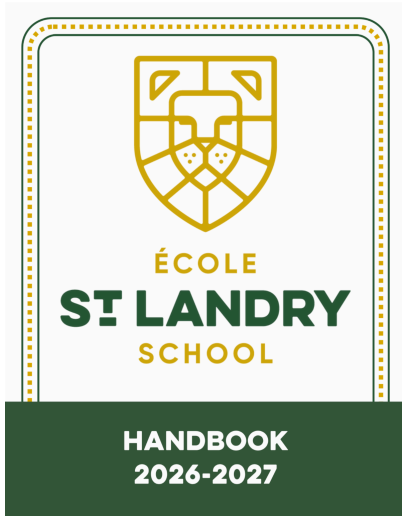
Our Parent and Family Engagement Team Policy is [online now](#). It outlines the many efforts and events organized by École Saint-Landry each year to strengthen our school community between students, parents, teachers, and staff to ensure that students have the most possible options to succeed in their French immersion education experience.

Events like Coffee & Donuts with Madame Lindsay, Family Literacy Night, Family Math Night, Fête de la chaudière noire, mid-year Parent-Teacher Conferences, Grandparents Week, and others provide opportunities for families to come into school, have a look around, get a feel for how things are going, get to know teachers and staff, and be a part of École.

We organize three meetings a year to discuss these engagement efforts, and all are welcome to attend online or in person. At most of the events and at each meeting, we'll ask you to sign in and provide feedback that we in turn are required to turn into the district to continue receiving our Title 1 funding that allows us to make these events fun with door prizes, snacks, games, books, and more. 2026-2027 Parent Welcome Packet Published



Our updated **Parent Welcome Packet** for the 2026-2027 school year has now been published on our website. We will update it once our new parking turnaround is complete, but nothing else should change for this school year. As always, we will announce any amendments as they are made.

Please remember to carefully review the **Parent Welcome Packet** each year, as it changes with State and District policies, as well as our own board-approved decisions as a charter school.

It is vital for us to be on the same page with you about our policies, and we prefer to communicate everything through this one, easily-accessible reference.

Changes to Our Attendance Policy

Attendance is incredibly important in all schools, but it is even more important at an immersion school because most of our students do not have family members who speak French. Simply put: we cannot teach a student who is absent.

École Saint-Landry takes attendance extremely seriously. Repeated violators of our attendance policy are reported to St. Landry Parish Juvenile Court, which is directly related to Child Welfare Services.

You may review our updated attendance policy in our **Parent Welcome Packet**, but the following changes are most notable:

- A maximum of three parental excuses a year will be accepted, each for no more than two consecutive days.
- École Saint-Landry has several remote learning days scheduled on our Academic Calendar. In order to be counted as present on remote learning days, the student must return the work packet sent home by the teacher for that day on the very next day he or she returns to school.
- Students arriving after 8:30 a.m. will be marked tardy.
- One late check-in or early check-out, even if only a few minutes late or early, counts as an attendance infraction for the purposes of truancy tracking in accordance with the new guidelines established by the Louisiana Department of Education.
- To encourage students to arrive on time, classes will be rated every Friday to see which has the best attendance for that week (the fewest absences tardies and early check-outs). The winning class will be rewarded with a special treat.
- Tardies or early check-outs for regular, valid obligations outside school may be excused due to our later dismissal, provided we have an excuse from the doctor, coach, or diocese explaining the reason for the absence, such as appointment or class time, address of the facility, etc.

- The maximum number of unexcused days that can be missed during a semester is five, or ten days per school year. Families who acquire 5 late check-ins, unexcused absences, or early check-outs within a semester will be referred to juvenile court for truancy.
- Failure to comply with restorative measures (signing and returning warning letters, watching informational video and taking quiz after three absences, attending truancy meetings, etc.) will result in immediate referral to Child Welfare and Attendance at Opelousas City Court.
- Potential consequences assigned by the court starting in 2025 include:
 - First offense (RS 17:233): punishable by a fine of not more than \$50 **and** not more than 25 hours of community service
 - Subsequent offenses (RS 17:221): fined not more than \$250 **or** imprisonment for not more than 30 days **or** both
 - AND
 - Attendance in an online parenting class/family counseling/court-approved programs.
 - Suspension of any recreational license issued by the Department of Wildlife and Fisheries
 - The truant child may be placed in a home or in a public or private institution where school is provided.

Starting with the 2026-2027 school year, all public schools in Louisiana are now required to report attendance and truancy status not to the local school board but directly to the Louisiana Department of Education daily.

École Saint-Landry is Moving to Class Dojo

In response to the many problems our parents voiced concerning issues with Rooms, we will now be using Class Dojo for our parent communication platform. For all matters concerning your child's school work and behavior, you will use Class Dojo to communicate with your child's teacher. This is also where homework, photos from class, and other important class-specific information will be shared.

All information pertaining to absences, excuses for absences and check-outs, and other such questions should be directed to office@ecolestlandry.org. We reply quickly to email and ask that you always email rather than call the school--we only have one line, so in the case of an emergency like a sick child, we need to be able to call out quickly.

We will continue to use the district platform for sending out school-wide alerts about emergency closures, buses not running, etc. so please make sure you always alert the office if you change your phone number or email address.

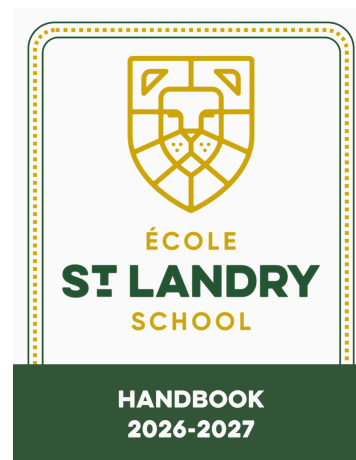

- Lion Care students in grades 4-6 will be brought by bus from our lower campus to our upper campus and back in the afternoon.
- Elementary and middle school bus riders will use the same buses and satellite stops.
- In the morning, buses will drop off middle school students first at 223 Marie Street, and then elementary students will be dropped off at 671 Napoleon Street.
- In the afternoon, buses will pick up middle school bus riders then elementary school bus riders and then proceed to the appropriate stops to drop students off.
- After care students and middle school students who are car riders AND have a sibling(s) at the elementary will be transported to the elementary school where after care students will await parent pickup by 5:30 p.m. and parents with children at both schools can make only one stop to pick them up at the elementary school.

General Information:

Attendance/check-ins and -outs:

If your child is going to be absent, please do not call us. **If your child will be out of school for two or more days**, you can **email us** or just send the doctor's excuse in their green folder when they return to school. We can also accept **up to three** hand-written parental excuses per school year. Parental excuses can only cover two consecutive days of absence. If your child is sick longer than that, you will need a doctor's excuse to have the extra days covered. Any excuse must be received within five days of the absence.

You may also request make-up work, homework, and more to be prepared by the teacher for you to pick up in the office.

If you are running late, please remember to sign in your child in the office when you get here. You do not need to let us know in advance.

If you need to check your child out early, please come to the office to sign him out before 3:15 p.m. You do not need to let us know in advance unless you have an official reason for needing to check your child out between 3:15 and 3:45. In that case, please **email us.**

Transportation changes:

If your child is usually a bus-rider but you will be picking him or her up today, or vice-versa, or if you need to leave your child in afternoon Lion Care today, please **email us** before 3:15 p.m.

We request email whenever possible so we have a paper trail of your instructions. If ever you email and we do not reply by 3:15 p.m., please call the office at (337) 510-3022 to confirm that your email was received.
